Residential Recycling Information

Recycling may not be exciting, but it's important and easy. Here is some helpful information!

What recyclables does the City of Dallas accept?

PLASTIC, GLASS, CARTONS, METAL, PAPER, CARDBOARD



Plastics

Only bottles & containers with the recycling symbol for numbers 1-7.

NO plastic bags, NO Styrofoam products, NO chemical containers



Metal

Aluminum, tin, and steel containers



Cartons

Refrigerated and shelf-stable cartons



Glass

Bottles and jars of any color.

For the safety of our collection staff, please contain any broken glass in a paper bag before placing in your cart.

NO window glass, NO light bulbs, NO ceramics, NO Pyrex, No fiberglass



Paper



Office paper (paperclips and staples are OK), window envelopes, magazines, catalogues, paper back books, phone books, and brown paper bags.

NO shredded paper, NO rubber bands, NO plastic wrappings



Cardboard

Shipping boxes, paper egg cartons, 12pack drink cartons, cereal boxes

NO waxed cardboard, NO plastic or foil lining from cereal or cracker boxes, NO pizza boxes or food contaminated boxes

Recyclables should be placed into your roll cart without any plastic baggage. Plastic bags are considered contamination.



If required, recyclables can be transported in old cardboard boxes or paper bags.

Where can we recycle items not currently collected by the City of Dallas?

Plastic Grocery Bags—The film used for grocery bags and newspaper sleeves is not recyclable by the City of Dallas at this time. However, many grocery stores may take back your grocery bags, or you may reuse them yourself.

Styrofoam—The City of Dallas does not accept Styrofoam products or peanuts. The packing peanuts can be taken to various parcel/shipping businesses for reuse or recycling. Styrofoam may also be placed in your garbage for disposal.

Electronics—Stop, drop, and go to one of the city's four drop off e-cycling locations. This service is provided to all Dallas residents at no charge. For more information, visit the Dallas Sanitation website. Some electronics may also be recycled at our local Staples store across the street from our neighborhood. Amenity Center Parking

There have been accidents, including an injured cyclist. Additionally, many pedestrians cross the street in this area. It is not safe to park along the curve and block visibility.

University Place Crime Awareness Update: 2024 Q1

We are pleased to share there have been no reported incidents of crime within our neighborhood.

There have been 23 reported incidents of crime on our neighboring streets, bounded by Hillcrest Ave, Campbell Rd, Waterview Ave, and Frankford Rd. Overall, our region on the map experienced only 23 crimes in total in 2024 Q1, most of which where residential burglaries (26%), theft from a motor vehicle (26%), and other thefts (22%). These crimes occurred *outside* of the University Place neighborhood.

If you experience crime in the neighborhood, please report it to the Dallas Police Department.

- For emergencies, call 911.
- Minor, past incidents, such as vehicle theft, can be reported on <u>dallaspolice.net</u>, which will guide users as to whether it is online-worthy or must be called into 911.
- Minor incidents can also be done via the app, iwatchdallas (dallas.iwatch911.us).



LOCK, TAKE, and HIDE

There have been recent observations of theft from motor vehicles in our community. The best way to prevent this type of crime is to follow the "take, lock, and hide" approach. Ensure you take valuables out of your vehicle, ensure all points of access to your vehicle are locked, and for those items you cannot take, hide them out of clear sight in your vehicle, such as under your seat, or in your truck.

Here are 7 key things you can do to help deter and prevent a break-in to your vehicle:

- 1. If possible, park in a well-lit area to make it clear who is at your vehicle.
- 2. Take your keys and valuables with you.
- 3. Lock all doors to your car.
- 4. Do not leave valuables in plain sight. Hide them from view if you must leave them in your car.
- Completely close the windows and sunroof to your car when you park.
 Although it gets hot in Texas, putting up a sun visor is cheaper than someone breaking into your car.



- 6. Never leave a spare set in your car. Do not give a thief incentive to take your whole vehicle.
- 7. Do not leave your registration receipt or title into your car. These are documents that can be altered and



Water your yard before 10 a.m. or after 6 p.m. from April 1 to October 31.

Don't forget time of day watering restrictions have begun!

Violations of these outdoor watering guidelines can result in fines of \$250 to \$2,000 per incident. First offenses will be issued a warning.

Water Conservation Ordinance Requirements

- Water before 10 a.m. or after 6 p.m. from April 1 to October 31.
- Observe the maximum twice per week watering schedule.
- Don't water during any form of precipitation. All automatic sprinkler systems are required to have working rain and freeze sensors.
- Repair any broken, missing or misdirected sprinkler heads.
- Watering driveways, sidewalks or streets is prohibited.
- Watering resulting in runoff onto streets, sidewalks or other drainage area is prohibited.

Watering by hand, drip irrigation or the use of soaker hoses will be permitted at any time.

Experts recommend you water no more than twice a week!

If you give your lawn one inch of water every five to seven days, the water will sink in and encourage the roots to grow stronger. **Deep and infrequent watering** is key to keeping your lawn healthy and your water costs under control all summer long.
